

# Friends of Glen Goyle – report from site visit 23 February 2023

## **General points:**

- INFRASTRUCTURE:
  - some benches will have to be 1.8m to fit into alcoves
  - o path from top 'vehicle entrance' to be opened up to allow for easy accessibility
  - possible painting of fencing
- FUNDING:
  - EDDC should be able to pay for new set of plants come next financial year
  - looking to apply for Heritage Lottery funding
- PLANNING:
  - see Connaught Gdns Management Plan as example for Glen Goyle
  - to included site history, photos, current/April-June 2023 plans, public comments
- PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT:
  - create online survey; asking passers-by and recording responses

#### **Manor Park Rd entrance:**

- railway sleepers to create retaining wall/bank on right but need to be aware of creosote issue
- some planting under beech on left: low-growing berberis/thorn/mahonia
- continue rocks to delineate path
- wooden dog pee post
- interpretation board:
  - o QR codes, website, have your say, join up
  - send any sightings of birds to RSPB/DWT/SVBG

# Path up Glen:

- cut back to stimulate growth: pruning to let in more light and lift the canopy to the areas at the south end close to the stream.
- no more trees needed
- under-storey planting: smaller rhododendron, camellia, skimmia, buddleia
- leave wild habitat on far bank
- · some planting on banks by bridge

### Meadow/lawn:

- consensus from those present: mown paths through longer meadow grass
  - Paul F to ensure SteetScene are instructed well in advance
- fernery to be established in cleared circular raised bed working with Ed Dolphin

#### **Seafield Road entrance:**

- create a 'dell' with picnicking area/bench
- winter/late spring planting and ow shrubs/hazel
- signature FOGG plant to welcome Chinese Lantern tree
- double litter bin to replace current dog bin
- small notice/interpretation board
